PROCEDURES FOR STUDENTS WHO REQUIRE MEDICATION DURING THE SCHOOL DAY

Itasca School District 10 recognizes that some students will require medication during the school day in order to protect their health and well-being. A District 10 Medication Authorization Form must be completed and signed by both the health care provider and the parent or legal guardian. The name of the medication, the dosage, the route, and the time to be given must be provided by the physician. The physician signature must also be on the form. The authorization is in effect for the current school year only. A new authorization is required each school year and when a dosage changes. This is required for both prescription and over-the-counter medication. The parent or legal guardian will provide the medication in the original pharmaceutical container, with a proper pharmacy label affixed. The label will agree with the medication that is in the container. All controlled substance medications will be brought by a parent or their adult designee. School personnel and the parent will verify the number of pills together and sign a log. If tablets are to be split to achieve the proper dosage, the parent or legal guardian will do this before sending the medication to school. School personnel will not split tablets. > Over-the-counter medications: The medication will be brought to school in the original container, with the student's name clearly marked on the package. A District 10 medication authorization form, completed by the health care provider, is required. Asthma inhalers and Epi-pens: students may carry and use their inhalers and Epi-pens in school when the following items have been completed. For metered dose inhalers a **District 10 Parent Authorization Form** must be completed by the parent or guardian and the prescription label must be provided. For Epi-pens a **District 10 Medication Authorization Form** must be completed by the health care provider and the prescription label must be provided. An extra inhaler or Epi-pen is recommended to be kept in the nurse's office. ➤ Allergy and asthma care plans, completed by a health care provider, are strongly recommended. Medications must be picked up by the parent or legal guardian at the end of the school year. Medications that are not picked up on the last day of school will be disposed of. > Students will self-administer medications whenever possible, under the supervision of school personnel. ➤ Itasca District 10 retains the right to reject requests for administration of medication. Parents may elect to come to the school to administer their child's medication at school.
